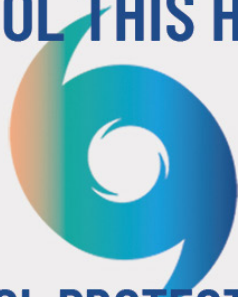


PROTECT YOUR POOL THIS HURRICANE SEASON



HURRICANE POOL PROTECTION CHECKLIST

BE PREPARED: JUNE 1 – NOVEMBER 30

BEFORE THE STORM

- **Keep It Full:** Do not drain your pool. Water weight prevents “pool popping” from ground pressure.
- **Trim & Tidy:** Cut branches and remove loose debris.
- **Shock the Pool:** Super chlorinate in case of power loss.
- **Power Down:** Turn off breakers; cover equipment.
- **Secure Items:** Bring furniture/toys indoors.

DURING THE STORM

- **Stay Safe:** Remain indoors. Do not use the pool.

AFTER THE STORM

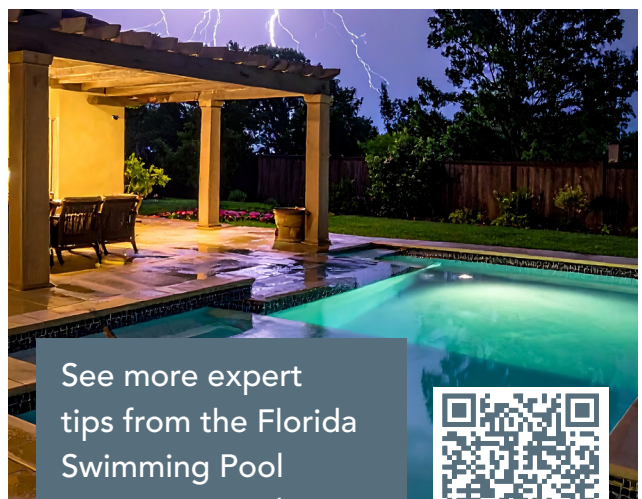
- **Inspect First:** Ensure equipment is dry before restoring power. Check wiring and breakers.
- **Clean Safely:** Remove large debris by hand, avoid damaging surfaces or clogging equipment.
- **Balance Water:** Test, adjust chemicals, and reset timers.
- **Water Level:** Drain excess rainwater only to normal level.

CLEAN-UP TIPS

- **Never Drain Your Pool:** Risk of serious structural damage (“pool popping”).
- **Remove Debris First:** Use a net; avoid running system if clogged or damaged.
- **Check Equipment:** Flooded systems likely need professional repair.
- **Call a Pro if Needed:** If you can’t see the bottom or damage is severe, hire a licensed contractor.
